#### PRESIDENT REAGAN AND ME

It's January and that always reminds me of President Reagan's Inauguration that I attended 39 years ago in 1981. I had had a crush on Ronald Reagan ever since I saw the movie KING'S ROW when I was about 11 years old. It was playing at one of my family's theaters that showed older movies and I was waiting for my parents to finish work and take me home. It was the saddest movie I had ever seen and I still remember sitting in the dark theater and crying and

crying when the psycho-doctor operated on Reagan's character, Drake McHugh. I have watched it several times over the years and it still strikes a sentimental nerve. I don't want to tell you anymore in case you have never seen the film. I highly recommend it. (I will tell you that KING'S ROW was nominated for best picture at the 1942 Academy Awards and the title of Reagan's 1965 autobiography, WHERE'S THE REST OF ME?, came from that movie. You can probably find it online). After that, I never missed a Reagan movie, Including KNUTE ROCKNE, ALL AMERICAN. which was the story of the famous Notre Dame football coach. Reagan played the role of All American quarterback George Gipp who was the subject of Rockne's "Win one for the Gipper" speech. That expression was later used as a political slogan by Ronald Reagan, who was often referred to as "The Gipper".

I also followed his television career as the weekly host of General Electric Theater, but the other part of his 8 year GE deal was being GE's traveling ambassador, meeting and speaking to the company's quarter of a million employees at about 140 factories in 40 states. The experience gave Reagan a chance to interact with real American workers which helped when his future election rivals were politicians in Washington.

Anyway, little did I know back then that the little 11 year old girl would one day have the chance to meet her movie idol. It was over 30 years later that I first had the opportunity to meet Ronald Reagan. <u>Click here to read on.</u>





#### FLORIDA'S VOTER REGISTRATION TIGHTENS UP

Secretary of State Laurel Lee recently announced that Florida has been accepted for membership, along with 29 other members, into the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC), a multi-state partnership that uses a sophisticated datamatching tool to enhance the accuracy of voter registration systems.

Through ERIC, member states can share information from voter registration

systems, motor vehicle databases, social security death records, and U.S. Post Office records. This data-sharing agreement will help identify voters who have moved to another state, passed away, or changed their name in Florida.
